A powerful earthquake with a magnitude of 7.8 strikes Nepal, with its epicenter north-west of the capital Kathmandu. Almost 9,000 people lose their lives, and more than 600,000 houses are damaged.

Help arrives

Within days of the earthquake devastating communities across Nepal, ChildFund commences distribution of food items and shelter supplies in Sindhupalchowk district, one of the worst-affected areas.

Back to school

ChildFund constructs 60
Temporary Learning Spaces at 32
sites where schools were damaged
or destroyed, to help ensure
children can return to school as
quickly as possible.

Protecting children

ChildFund establishes 21 Child Centered Spaces in Sindhupalchowk and Ramechhap districts to provide safe places for children to gather, play and receive trauma support.

Student supplies

As part of ChildFund's "Back-to-School campaign", more than 5,000 children are given school supplies, including a school bag, school uniform, notebooks and pens.

Dignity for girls

Addressing the rights of adolescent girls, ChildFund provides dignity kits to more than 800 female students, containing hygiene products as well as protection items such as torches.

Clean water and sanitation

Drinking-water facilities and toilets are repaired or rebuilt in 11 schools, ensuring children have access to safe water and sanitation.



Long-term recovery

ChildFund is planning and coordinating long-term recovery work around school reconstruction and renovation, and continues to support children through our sponsorship program.

ChildFund will continue to support children in Nepal to safeguard their rights and wellbeing.
